The City Clerk's office provides the services of a Commissioner of Oaths to witness signatures for certain documents. There is a fee of \$25.00 charged for 1-3 signatures. The City Clerk normally prefers people to call ahead on the number above for an appointment. Please note the Commissioner will not sign wills or separation and/or custody agreements.

Every Friday morning from 9 am to 12 noon at the Courthouse. Must be in a receipt of OW/ODSP or have limited income to attend FLIC. You will have the opportunity to speak privately with a Family Law Lawyer.
